





Precautions for Patients Under Local Anesthesia on the Day of Surgery

<p>No metal items</p>		<p>Please remove by yourself, the hospital is not responsible for keeping.</p>	<p>Wearing metal objects during surgery can increase the risk of skin burns when using electrosurgical instruments during the procedure.</p>
<p>No nail polish (including light-cured polish)</p>		<p>Please remove nail polish and gel polish on at least the thumbs and big toes of both hands and feet before surgery.</p>	<p>Applying nail polish or gel manicures may interfere with blood oxygen monitoring and can also prevent healthcare professionals from observing the nail bed's blood circulation during the procedure.</p>
<p>Patients undergoing eye surgery are advised not to have any facial makeup, including eye makeup, foundation, lipstick, etc.</p>		<p>Please remove your makeup before the surgery to facilitate thorough disinfection by the nursing staff.</p>	<p>Incomplete makeup removal may affect the surgical procedure and increase the risk of infection.</p>

Precautions for Patients Under Local Anesthesia on the Day of Surgery

<p>No contact lenses</p>		<p>Please remove by yourself before surgery, including pupil dilation drops.</p>	<p>Wearing contact lenses can interfere with the eye surgery process.</p>

1. Medication precautions:

- 1.1 Avoid taking anticoagulants (such as aspirin, Plavix, etc.), ginkgo, fish oil, vitamin E, and other similar medications for 2-3 days before the surgery.
- 1.2 If you have asthma or regularly use bronchodilators, use one dose in the morning of the surgery and carry your bronchodilator medication with you.

2. Other precautions:

- 2.1 If you are pregnant, have hepatitis, or have any infectious diseases, please inform the nursing staff in advance.
- 2.2 If you have any questions before the surgery, please raise them with the nursing staff or doctor so that they can assist you promptly.
